Since 1996, The Christmas Box International has defended **over 130,000 children.** That's enough to fill Madison Square Garden more than 6 times!

The Christmas Box International has been helping **trafficked children and youth for more than two decades**, **providing shelter**, **schooling and aftercare** to help these youth live productive, happy lives.

LAST YEAR...

The Christmas Box International **served 9,942 youth** who were victims of abuse, trafficking, neglect or homelessness. Our 3 shelters provided **more than 17,000 days of care** to at-risk children in Utah.

(That's a combined **46.7 years of care**in the last **12 months!**)

Children and Youth Programs

Christmas Box Houses — Every year, our short-term emergency shelters provide protection for nearly a thousand children who are removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect and abandonment.

Christmas Box Resource Rooms — Each year, The Christmas Box International distributes nearly a million dollars' worth of much-needed donations through our community resource rooms for at-risk children being supported by the Department of Human Services. These resource rooms provide items such as clothing, school supplies, books, toys, hygiene and baby items.

Journey Up Program — The Christmas Box International provides resources to programs which provide housing, employment and support for young adults facing homelessness, ages 18–22.

Trafficking Support — Over the last decade the Christmas Box House facilities have expanded their emergency shelter program to take in children who have been trafficked and are facing homelessness. We partner with organizations who have an outstanding reputation in the community and a proven track record, to help them reunite children with their families.

Project Elf — Gifts and resources are collected statewide to help make the holiday season brighter for neglected and at-risk children and young adults in Utah.

International Projects — In addition to serving the U.S., The Christmas Box International provides resources to at-risk children in Haiti, India, Kenya, Mexico, Ecuador, Peru, and Colombia.








Putting the "FUN" in Fundraisers!

The possibilities are endless... and that's the best part! **The Kids Helping Kids program** challenges YOU to get creative in putting together the best fundraising strategy possible. We know the power of students who care; here's an example:

A local high school dedicated the month of December to hosting events and volunteering to collect donations on behalf of the children we serve. They rallied entire legions of students, teachers, business owners and community leaders to support their cause, and it worked! They raised a record amount for their school and thousands of dollars to help children in their community who are victims of abuse, neglect or abandonment.

Kids Helping Kids

 ¶ e have learned that there is no one way to help raise money for a worthwhile cause. Instead,
 there are many ways to do small acts that can add up quickly. So challenge your classmates, teachers, and communities to get involved too.

Here are a few creative idea to get you started!

- **CANDY GRAMS** This tried and true classic takes a small amount of advertising and a sweet tooth. Students pay to send their messages to friends. Delivery times may vary.
- **PAY TO COSPLAY** Whether inspired by a classic Star Wars Sith, a Marvel character or an obscure Doctor Who reference, students can buy a "get-out-of-normal-clothes" card with the added bonus of a ComicCon in the halls.
- **FOOD FOR THOUGHT** Partner with businesses in your community to host fun events off campus. Many restaurants will work with student groups to donate a portion of sales to your fundraiser if only asked to do so. All that's left to do is get the word out. All it takes is approaching the manager of a popular nearby spot and asking.
- **CONCERTS AND SHOWS** Events are a great way to give something back while still fundraising. Use your high school auditorium to book a local band or put on a movie screening where you can sell tickets.
- **DONATE YOUR TIME** Consider volunteering. Get a group together and canvas neighborhoods offering to complete small odd jobs for donations.

- **BATTLE OF THE BANDS** Charge admission and sell refreshments for a concert or battle of the bands featuring your school's students.
- **CLUBS COMPETE** Ask for support from the clubs and sports teams at your school to see if they would be willing to host an event alongside your efforts. This could be anything from a school assembly with performances, a special concert or even a lunchtime activity calling for small donations such as date auctions, or a trivia game.
- **CHUCK YOUR CHANGE** Hold a competition between grades and see who can collect the most change over the course of a week, a month or even a single assembly. A front and center display of how well each class is doing, can help spur on your classmates.
- A BETTER BAKE SALE Who doesn't love some deliciously prepared baked goods? Frosting or sprinkles or both, there's nothing like a bake sale to attract donations. To take it to the next level try different items for a week during lunch break, popular food stuff such as hot chocolate, popcorn balls, or churros.
